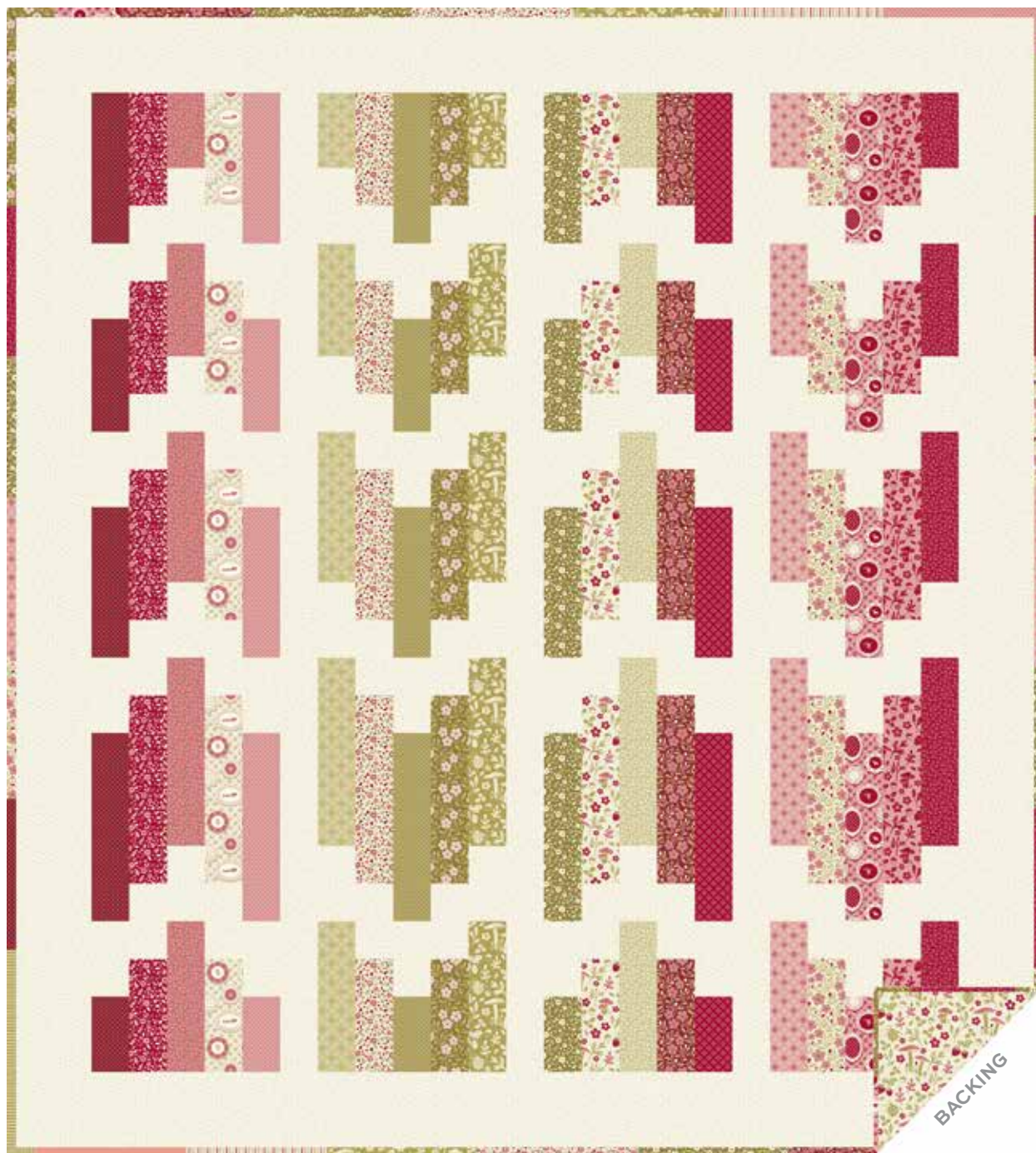

Quilt finishes 54" x 60"

For anyone in need of a quick project or for anyone who wants to make a first quilt, this delightful design fits the bill. Made with only rectangles, the stairstep placement means there are NO seams that need to match.

Making the Quilt

When making the blocks, refer to these labels and the list of fabrics on the last page of the pattern.

2½" Strip Roll		
Cream	border 2 yards	W
Binding	leftovers	
Backing	3¾ yards	E

Cutting Directions

Note: Read assembly directions before cutting patches. All measurements are cut sizes and include ¼" seam allowances. Borders are cut the exact lengths required plus ¼" seam allowances. WOF designates the width of fabric from selvedge to selvedge (approximately 42" wide).

Fabric W

Cut (2) top/bottom borders 4½" x 54½"

Cut (2) side borders 4½" x 52½"

Cut (3) sashes 2½" x 52½"

Cut (80) rectangles 2½" x 4½"

One 2½" strip

Cut the rectangles needed for each fabric as shown in Quilt Assembly

Binding

Cut leftover 2½" strip rolls (Read Step 6.)

Backing

Cut (2) lengths 35" x 64", pieced to fit quilt top with overlap on all sides

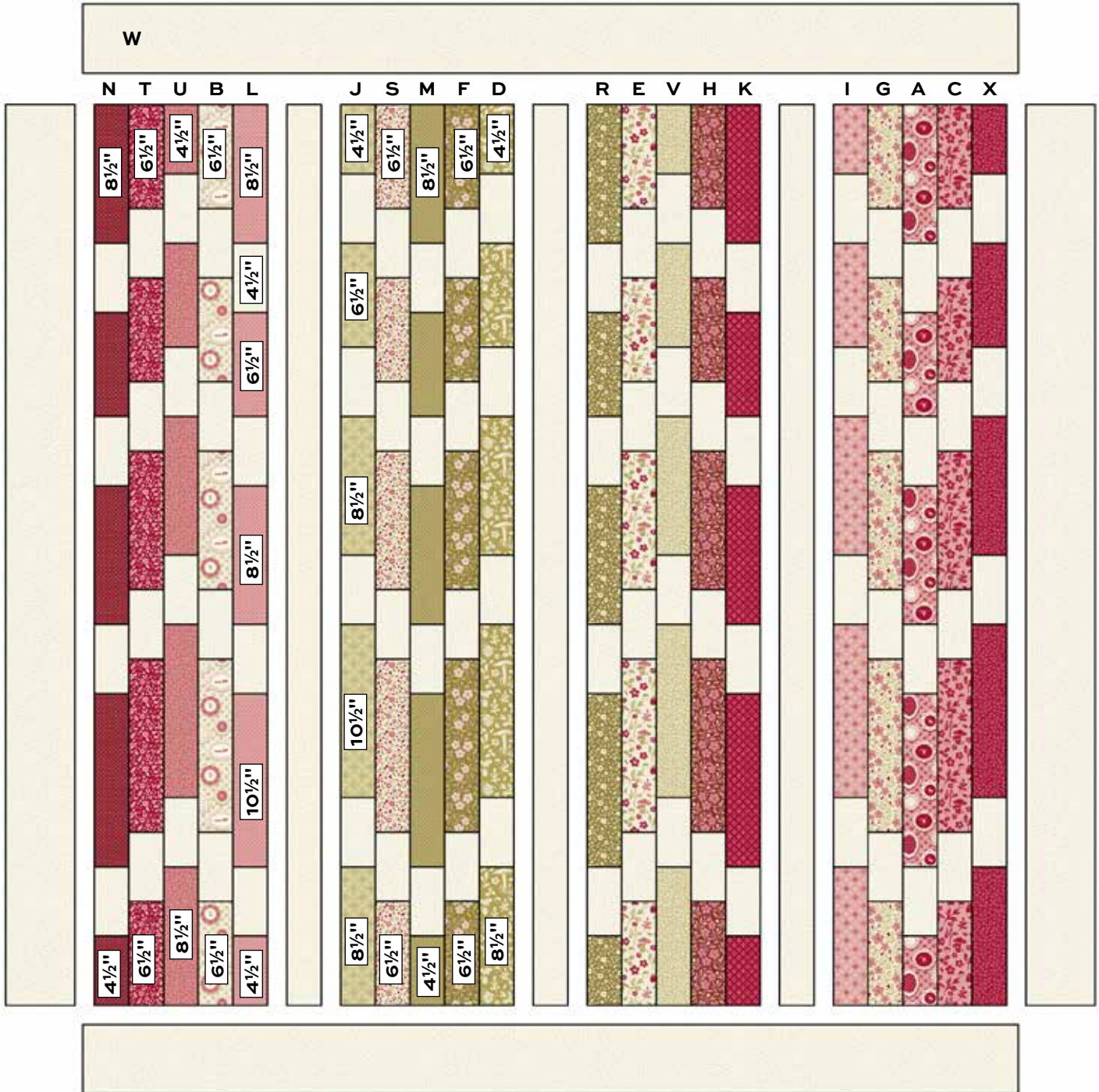
Making the Quilt

1. Refer to the Quilt Assembly for all steps. Note that each vertical column is made with Fabric W rectangles and one of the Jelly Roll strips. Working with one column at a time, cut the number of rectangles as shown. Join the patches into a column, pressing seam allowances away from Fabric W patches.
2. Repeat this step to make 20 vertical columns.
3. Arrange the vertical columns in the correct order. Stand back to be certain that no column has been misplaced. Once you are satisfied, join the columns into groups of 5. Press the seam allowances in one direction or open. Sew Fabric W sashes between the groups.
4. Sew shorter Fabric W borders to the sides. Sew longer Fabric W borders to the top and bottom.

Finishing the Quilt

5. Layer the quilt with batting and backing and baste. Quilt in the ditch around borders and patches. Quilt the colored rectangles as you wish. Or, quilt an overall design.
6. From leftover fabrics (including Fabrics O, P, and Q), cut rectangles various lengths. Join them end to end to make double-fold binding that is approximately 6½ yards long. Bind the quilt in the usual manner.
